

Kitsap County Voter Registration

Washington State has a permanent voter registration system. The county auditor serves as official registrar and appoints deputy registrars for all of Kitsap County. Citizens may register **online**, at city halls, libraries, public schools, most federal and state agencies including the Department of Licensing at the Kitsap County Auditor's Office, and at voter registration drives.

To become a registered voter a person must be:

- A United States citizen
- Eighteen years old on or before the next election (16 and 17-year-olds please see [Future Voter](#) information)
- A legal resident of the State of Washington
- Not under the authority of the Department of Corrections for a Washington felony conviction.
- Note: If you were convicted of a felony, your right to vote is automatically restored as long as you are not currently serving a Department of Corrections sentence of total confinement in prison.
- **Not** disqualified from voting due to a court order

Registration Deadlines-A person may register to vote at any time. However, there are registrations deadlines before each election. If you need to register to vote and are unable to obtain a state license or I.D. card please contact us by using the [Online Questions and Service Requests](#) form.

Registration Deadlines

8 Days Before an Election

- Last day for online voter registration for new Washington voters
- Last day for mail-in voter registration for new Washington voters
- Last day for online and mail-in address changes for existing Washington voters

8 p.m. Election Day

- Deadline for in-person voter registration for new Washington voters and address changes for existing Washington voters.
- Go **in person** to:
 - Kitsap County Elections, 619 Division St. Port Orchard, WA 98366
 - Marvin Williams Recreation Center, 725 Park Avenue, Bremerton, WA 98337
 - Poulsbo Vote Center, Poulsbo Fire Station, 911 NE Liberty Road, Poulsbo, WA 98370

The deadlines listed above do not apply to military and overseas voters, who may register to vote in Washington through 8 p.m. on Election Day.

Important Links and Forms

Online Voter Registration

If you have a current Washington driver's license or state ID, you can register to vote online. Once registered you can use this link to see your voting history and a list of your elected officials. You can also update your voter registration name and address.

Printable Voter Registration Form

If don't have a Washington ID you can use this printable PDF (1 page, 284KB) and return it to our office for new voter registration and name or address changes.

Signature Update

Your signature may have changed over the years. Use this form to provide your most recent signature, which we will keep on file and use in future elections.

Printable Registration Cancellation Form

Print sign and return this PDF (1 page, 20KB) if you have moved out of the county or wish for any reason to cancel your voter registration. If you are a registered voter you can also use this form to let us know if another voter is deceased.

Federal Voting Assistance Program

The federal government provides contact information and other resources for military and overseas voters to register and vote from wherever you are.

Challenging a Voter's Registration
