The League of Women Voters of Kitsap's Voter Services Committee focuses on three key areas related to voting: voter registration, voter forums, and Get Out the Vote campaigns.

Voter Registration

Many of our League members participate in voter registration drives. Throughout the year, we go to locations (such as high schools, farmers markets, college campuses, libraries, the Salvation



Army, etc.) to register voters and help people update their voter registration data.

Get Out The Vote

Before elections, many of our League members partiipate in Get Out the Vote campaigns. You'll see us with our signs on busy corners, near the ferry as it unloads, and walking around the local college campus, all to remind voters to send in their ballots.



Voter Forums

Before primary and general elections, we sponsor informative voter forums. We invite candidates to answer questions from the public, and we invite experts to debate the pros and cons of certain ballot initiatives. The forums, **see pages 2 & 3**, typically are recorded; we post these recordings on our website afterwards.

VOTEWA.GOV

VoteWA.gov is an easy website for checking your voter registration status in Washington State, sponsored by the Washington Secretary of State. All you need is your name and date of birth. You can register to vote and make changes to your address or name. Also, you can check your voting history in the state, your elected officials, your state voter's guide, ballot drop box locations, and ballot status (i.e. has your ballot for the latest state election been received).

VOTE411

Vote411.org is a helpful website for voters, sponsored by the League of Women Voters Education Fund. Enter your address to find your polling place, build your ballot with our online voters' guide and much more! With our voters' guide you can see the races on your ballot, compare candidates' positions side-by-side, and print out a "ballot" indicating your preferences as a reminder.
