Important Election Dates in 2023

July 14-Aug 1	August Primary election period. Put a ballot in a drop box until 8 p.m. on Aug 1
July 14-24	Vote EARLY by US MAIL (after July 24, suggest using a ballot drop box)
July 24	Deadline to register to vote by mailed application or using VoteWA.gov
July 25-Aug 1	Register to vote in person at Kitsap Auditor's Office, weekdays 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Also open Saturday, July 29 and extra hours on Aug 1 (7 a.m. – 8 p.m.)
July 29, July 31, Aug 1	Register to vote in person and/or VOTE in person at a Voting Center (see below)
August 1	Primary Election Day. Drop your ballot at a ballot drop box, or vote in person at a Voting Center until 8 p.m.
Oct 20-Nov 7	General election period. Put ballot in a ballot drop box until 8 p.m. on Nov 7
Oct 20-30	Vote EARLY by US MAIL (after Oct 30, suggest using a ballot drop box)
Oct 30	Deadline to register to vote by mailed application or using VoteWA.gov
Oct 31-Nov 7	Register to vote in person at Kitsap Auditor's Office, weekdays 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Also open Saturday, Nov 4 and extra hours on Nov 7 (7 a.m. – 8 p.m.)
Nov 4, Nov 6, Nov 7	Register to vote in person and/or VOTE in person at a Voting Center (see below)
November 7	General Election Day. Drop your ballot at a ballot drop box, or vote in person at a Voting Center until 8 p.m.
